I'm a school librarian and I have to say that this particular book was such a joy to read! This is the perfect "transitional book" for those kids who are ready to make a leap from the basic children's chapter books to a genre that tackles everyday issues that pre-teens face when in middle school and beyond, but on a very age-appropriate level. As a Christian, and from a personal stand-point,

this is a refreshing book to see on the market that ties in those values I believe are so important to consider when kids face bullying. The main character handles this in such a great way, and it's in a way that every reader can appreciate regardless of their beliefs. And, let's face it, so many books on the topic of bullying have such a nice, tidy ending that kids see them as cheesy and unrealistic. I didn't find that to be the case at all with this book. While the book does end on a positive note, it does explore hurt feelings, choosing to ignore (which is tough when dealing with a bully), and then extending grace to the bully when turning the other cheek isn't as much fun as watching your enemy get their "just desserts".
