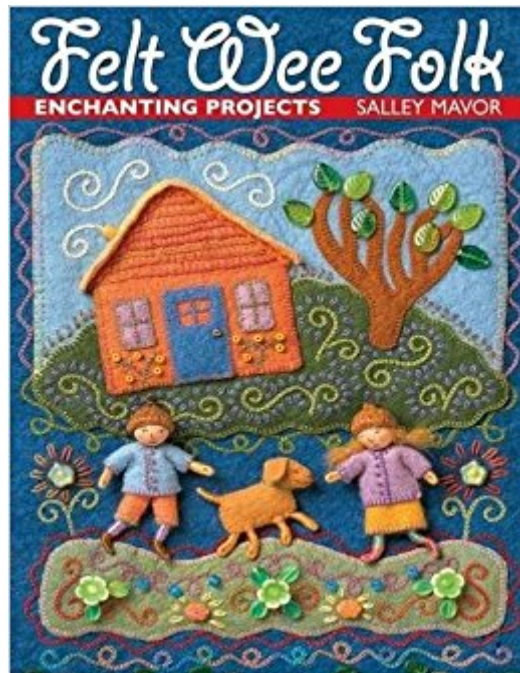

Salley Mavor is an award-winning children's book illustrator and the owner of Wee Folk Studio, She lives in Falmouth, MA.

Just received this today--so excited. The patterns are 3" tall tops for the kids and 4" max for adults. I want bigger people, so I plan to use the adult patterns for the kids and enlarge the adult patterns to make bigger adults--5.5-6" for the adults. This will make them work better for the 1:12 scale dollhouse I am making. The bigger dolls will also be a better option for out 3-5-year-old grandkids. The many options look easy to adapt and interchange in whatever way I want. For hair, I might just plug folded over strands of embroidery thread into the other hole of the wood bead heads and go from there. I'll get back to you on this. The other thing I'm going to do is create a portable dollhouse in a small suitcase or metal lunch box. I will make interchangeable scenes to velcro to the back using ideas from the "Fabric Relief Scenes" section in the book. Do not hesitate to buy this book and have fun with it!

You can make fabulous fairies if you get this book to guide you. I have made them for table decorations, grand children's play and for my friends. Now my grandchildren make them and are skilled at creating their own fairies. Wonderful source for many felt creations.

This book is great because it offers a craft project that most anyone can do. (Some of the dolls are so small that they are not appropriate for very young children, under age 3) The directions are clear. There is a list of mail order suppliers if you can not find the materials. The pictures are beautiful, the dolls are cute as a button, and there is a lot of room to create your own without exactly copying what she has done. I can not say enough buy the book.

Making small dolls, to carry, for a nature table, to give someone who needs a smile, is just so easy, with this instructions and inspiring patterns. My daughter made five the first few days we owned this. I highly recommend it, especially if you wish to have a project that is easy and compact to carry around.

I received this softbound book in a very timely manner. It was exactly the one I wanted except I wish the back cover hadn't been creased like someone folded it for some reason. Otherwise It's a nice addition to my craft book collection.

Sally's little felt people are darling, she has good directions. There are fun projects. It takes a bit of practice to wrap the dolls, but everyone liked the ones I tried. Her book has nice color photos. The print is a bit small in the directions for me. Her directions are clear and she gives a nice supply list.

My girls all adored this book! They spent a lot of cold winter days stitching and creating scads of wee felt folk. Although they are all adults I have recently purchased this book for each of them. Salley Mavor shares so many fun characters and her instructions are easy enough to follow that older kids can make their own "folk" with just a little adult help.

I haven't tried to make any of the projects in the book yet, but I do love it's layout and I'm looking forward to trying it out!

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
