The company was founded in 1984 by Michael Brown, who had been in international publishing for many years, setting up subsidiaries for textbook publishers. In the 1970s, Brown traveled extensively throughout Africa, India, the Middle East and Southeast Asia. Brown would take a large paper map, cut out the city center, folded it up and slip it into his pocket, thus preventing him from looking like a tourist in areas where discretion is the better part of travel. This was his tool for surviving. After many years on the road, Brown settled back in New York and decided to start his own business, based on the adaptations he had made to maps in his travels. His goal was to give someone the ability to navigate easily in unfamiliar terrain. He started with a new map format: the accordion fold. Such a simple idea, but at the time it was revolutionary. No more struggling to fold an awkward, oversized paper map. This new format would enable the user to blend in like a native, instead of stick out like a tourist. Brown then added lamination to ensure that the map would be a lasting tool. More important than the format was the design of the map itself. It had to be a map that not only succeeded above and beyond any map he had used, but was esthetically appealing as well. The look of it had to be as striking as the functionality. Color was introduced in a way that was never seen before in a map - vivid purple for water, soothing gray for the background of street grids, gold to highlight elements of the map. Clarity, conciseness and convenience in a very stylish package. Building the business was a 24 hour job. Brown sold the maps during the day, zipping around Manhattan making deliveries on his Harley Davidson. At night he packed the orders and did

the design work. More titles were added, each title requiring months of research and design. Today, STREETWISE® produces over 130 titles for major destinations, regions and countries throughout the United States, Canada, Mexico, Australia, Europe, the United Kingdom and Asia. We have grown from the back of a motorcycle to selling millions of maps around the world. Yet each title is still painstakingly researched and updated. STREETWISE® is one of the only, if not THE only map company that conducts research by walking or driving an area to ensure accuracy. After all, what good is the map if what you hold in your hands doesn't match what you see on the street sign? This lengthy fact checking results in superior accuracy; in effect, we've done the work, now you have the adventure. In the end, it's not about the map, it's about getting out and finding your own authentic experience wherever you go. It's about being in a city or a region and discovering things that you never thought you would find. You can do this if you have confidence and you have confidence if you have a great map. STREETWISE® is the great map that you need.

I bought one of these maps for my first visit to DC, and it proved to be well worth its price. (The Capitol Hill Hyatt where we stayed had free maps that were okay, but not as detailed and as easy to follow as the Streetwise map.) We walked about 5 miles one day with the map as our guide and not once were we the least bit confused about where we were or how to get to where we wanted to go next. When out alone walking with the map in my back pocket, usually for walks of a mile or more, then too it was the perfect guide, including at night (I carry a tiny Fenix LED Flashlight). I grew up in NYC and got spoiled by the relatively easy to follow layout; you got your numbered avenues and streets. I lived in SF where the layout took a bit of getting used to. Washington DC has the most complex layout of any US city I've been in. Thank goodness for the Streetwise map.

I've used Streetwise maps for several places and always have had great experiences. Pros: folds to brochure size, laminated so it can go in/out of a backpack or purse throughout the trip without tearing, has a section of just the Capital Mall section of the city which is where most of the notable places are, and has the metro and streets on the same map. Cons: none. TIPS: metro: Get unlimited pass for the number of days you will use metro in DC to save \$. You need to use the pass to get IN and OUT (the gates will block your pass if you say follow someone through a stroller gate). Learn what the "end of line" station is for the direction you are going so you get on the metro train going in the right direction. The lines are by color (different from NYC which has a letter or number for each line). The attendants at the metro stations are VERY friendly and helpful and actually left their booth on a regular basis to help people. TIP: use the compass on your smart phone to ensure

you are walking/driving in the right direction. There is a symbol which shows which direction is north on the map.

Nice compact, durable map. For the most part I use phone apps for reference and to get around, but sometimes a good old fashion, hard copy map is the best tool. This one is laminated so it's durable and unlike the old fashion folding ones from the gas stations and stores of my childhood this one has only a couple of folds and folds back the right way easily. LOL It's small enough to put in a back pocket and certainly a purse or backpack, but large enough to view even with 60 plus year old eyes. If you want a physical map of the Washington DC area I strongly can recommend this one.

This is the other map I mentioned having used recently in my review for the pocket-sized Streetwise Metro map. This map provides the perfect amount of information for both travel planning and daily use while in DC, although as I mentioned in my other review, "once you arrive at your destination you will likely be bombarded with maps from all sides." In addition to the maps that the other product provides - a map of the Metro subway in the Washington, DC area, and a map of the area south and east of George Washington University, south and west of Union Station (the train station with which you will want to connect via the Metro subway in the case you wish to travel via train outside of the Washington, DC area), and north of the Tidal Basin (although the Jefferson Memorial is off this map to the south) - this map also provides a highway map of the Washinton, DC and Baltimore areas as well as a detailed street map for the Washington, DC area south of National Zoological Park, north of the Pentagon, and west of the National Arboretum, with the east map border running midway through Arlington, VA. Initial planning for my daily runs while recently staying in Georgetown was not possible with the pocket-sized Streetwise Metro map, which did not extend that far west, so I used this map to get familiar with that area, and carried it with me everywhere as a reference while visiting the sites, since although the free maps are decent, this one provides more information and holds up with heavy use.

This map was very helpful during our trip to DC. It was my family's first time going, and we had no knowledge of the area. GPS is so unreliable these days, this map really saved us a lot of stress. We were easily able to map out where we wanted to go and how we could get there the quickest. A bonus is that I was able to teach my daughter how to read a map! She had a lot of fun helping me spot the street signs during the trip. I will definitely be holding on to this map for our next DC trip.

This Streetwise Washington DC Map is a very useful guide to navigating the nation's capital. Folded, it fits in a pocket or a purse. Extended, it offers three different views. One is a 1:31,000 scale view through the center of DC that takes in the Mall, Arlington on the Virginia side, and Capitol Hill. The second view is a close-up of the Mall, detailed enough to find your way around the various Smithsonian Buildings on foot. The third view covers the road network around the District of Columbia at 1:450,000 scale. Also included is a map of the Dc Metro rapid transit rail system, and a street index. The graphics are reasonably readable; the plastic map sheet is virtually indestructible and should last for years. Recommended.

WORTHLESS for actually using while trying to navigate DC. I would never buy this again or recommend it to anyone. It is totally and completely useless as a navigation tool. If you want to use a VERY POWERFUL magnifying glass and study this map at home, maybe it will have some value, but I was hoping for a map we could actually use while driving in DC.

Terrible map. Missing half of the city. All these great reviews discount how little information is present. It is essentially a map of a 4 mile wide strip in the touristy portion of the city.

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
