Why my fifth star is missing? Not because of the author, but because of the times around him. In the earlier epochs humanity had a very distinct reaction for any causes of sudden mass deaths, like, say, a plague: at first peoples run from the centers of contamination, like from hell. Later they learned to prevent epidemics. Any book, called "Is plague a danger?", would be undoubtedly appreciated by all the literate medieval readers. Well - to judge from the numbers of corpses, resulted from the leftist regimes' rule, they beat outbursts of the "Black Death" by many millions. Nevertheless, lefty theories are still as popular today as they were before excellent books on Stalin and Hitler's annihilation camps, Pol Pot's killing fields or Mao's re-education villages. Mr. Morse explains this strange "falling in love with plague" quite precisely: "Some believe that the failure of the Communist experiment in Russia was due to the Soviet Union just not getting it quite right. They believe that the ideals of Communism were right but the implementation was flawed. They would like to try it again" and, my, aren't they trying! Now these "some" are even trying to mix Communism with Islam, Nazi's dearest ally, and the new murderous cocktail doesn't frighten "some" at all. Hence, they hardly would be frightened by the discovery that Hitler was a leftist (especially while der Fuehrer's ideals are resurrected so eagerly by UN, EU and State Department in their efforts to create a purely Palestinian state without a single Jew within). As for the present-day leaders of "some", I do not think that in the core of their core they are even 1% leftists: for obamas, soroses and clintons the old Marxist clichés about social justice are just a reliable instrument to reach the desired Power Unlimited and nothing else. It means, that Mr. Morse's fine book is certainly written not to enlighten "some" or, moreover, their leaders. Whom, then? Truth to tell, I do not know. He got one-half of the spectrum correctly but ignored the other one.
