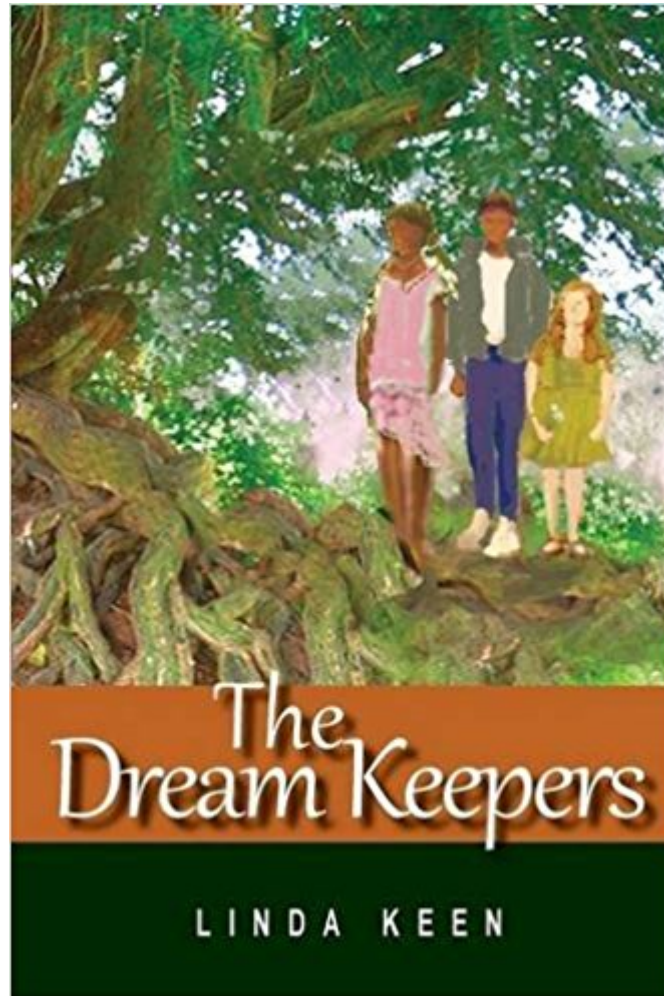




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The Dream Keepers

Mixing dreams with reality, she has a vivid imagination with which she allows herself to create fantasy worlds. The Dream Keepers is written by Linda Keen and published by Mill City Press. It is categorized under the Young Adult genre, and the major themes in the book are self-growth, friendship and family. This story revolves around the lives of two siblings, Star and Thatcher. Orphaned at a young age, these two children live the earlier part of their lives in relative bliss and happiness with their one set of grandparents. However, when these

grandparents are unable to take care of the two siblings due to health issues, they are sent to stay with their other grandparents, and it is here that they begin another stage in their lives. Their new grandparents and the new environment are vastly different from what they are used to. Their grandfather is a well-renowned poet and their grandmother is a somewhat erratic artist. The siblings try to adapt to their new home. Star begins a seemingly unbreakable friendship with another girl, Annabel. Thatcher goes through several trials in his relationship with their grandparents. This story spans the siblings' childhood and teenage years. It tells us their various struggles through issues such as racism, friendship, love, family issues, and the struggle to find themselves. Dispersed between the story are the vivid dreams that Star often has that somehow help to shape her as a person. The characters are very well developed, we see them grow and change from innocent children into adults who have to face the harsh realities of the world. The story-line is captivating and interesting. The story is set in recent times in America, the author makes the reader aware of this by bringing in relative news stories to highlight this fact. Uncanny now for its timeliness in relation to many aspects of our country's unfolding future, my story was intended to actuate teenage readers towards a better understanding of diversity, friendship, and self-knowledge. Its purpose was a hopeful step towards motivation--and possibly towards a genuine grasping--of environments and mindsets holding the potential to provide a young person of any race or faith with a sense of dignity, safety, and calm amidst the chaos and turmoil of daily life. This 21st century coming-of-age adventure tale is all-embracing, encouraging interest in varying aspects of everyday reality, from practical to spiritual. Its array of unfolding involvements demonstrates the healing power of love, nature, poetry and art, as well as appreciation for scholarship and science. As this book was first evolving, I became deeply impressed with poet Langston Hughes after unwittingly placing a poster of him on the wall of my counseling office at a school for students with behavior problems. Curious to know more about this distinguished-looking man, dubbed on the poster as "Poet Laureate of Harlem," I sought out his writings at my public library. Bringing home several books of his poetry, one of them entitled The Dream Keeper and Other Poems, I was profoundly moved, not only by this writer's insights and expressions of compassion and hope, but by his understanding of the racial challenges our world continues to face long after his passing. In connecting myself with the spirit of one of our country's most inspirational and beloved poets, the emotional journey of my fictional story had begun.

I enjoyed being taken on this unique journey with Star and Thatcher. I quickly felt I was with them on their travels; it was truly a magical experience. It was really hard to put the book down; eventually, sleep won the battle, but I couldn't wait to get back to reading. This book became a part of me, I was addicted. The only bad part was when it ended; I didn't want it to be over. It isn't often, that a book grabs ahold of me this deeply. Linda Keen weaves a story like a master weaver builds a magic carpet and her books take you on a wondrous ride with each little nuance of character development and spiritual adventure. In her past two books, *Intuition Magic* and *John Lennon in Heaven: Crossing the Borderlines of Being*, Keen mixes adventure with mystical insight to entertain, inform and heal her audiences. Her latest book is classified as children's literature, yet people of all ages are warmly invited to enjoy *Star and Thatcher O'Day*'s struggles to forge new relationships with elders, friends and strangers on their pathway to discover their own true selves. The settings are based on real but purposefully unspecified locations, adding a wonderful element of mystery. The children's growing years coming to terms with life's unexpected hardships and challenges offer an abundance of wisdom along with valuable ideas for proactive problem solving. I highly recommend this book for counselors, teachers, children (especially children struggling to fit-in after sudden change, loss and hardship), parents and school libraries and classrooms.

I really immensely enjoyed this book. I think what made it different was the unique style of writing. It had an almost dreamlike quality about it. It is not one that I have read often. It was interesting to read about the characters' struggles to adapt to their new environment as well as to see them grow into teenagers. Star is a brilliant character, who shines in her environment, although Thatcher is more relatable - being more introverted and unsure of himself.

The dream keeper's is a exquisite read that transports you to a different world while somehow hitting so close to home. This book tackles real issues and takes you on a rollercoaster of ideals and emotion while challenging reality simultaneously. It is complicated and complex while being caring and considerate.
