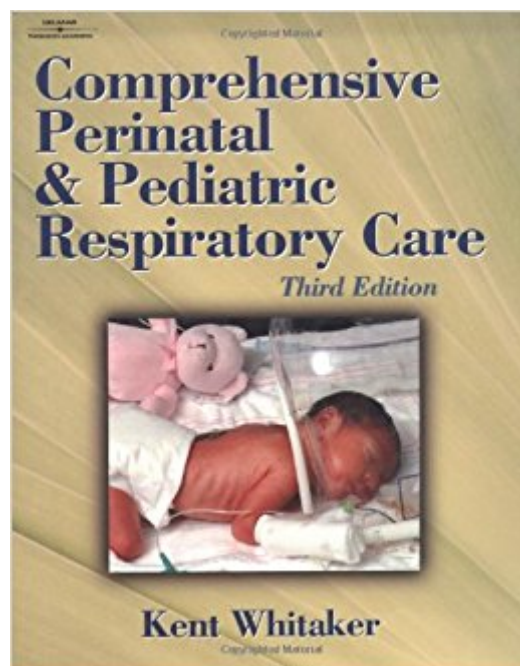

Also, there are tons of typos throughout the book (example: the chapter eleven questions are cut off, as if they left out a page or two.)
