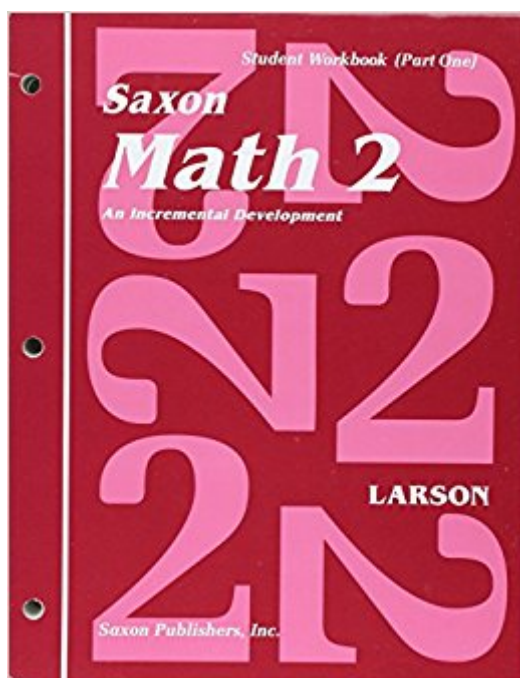


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# Saxon Math 2: An Incremental Development - Student Workbook, Part 1

We have used Saxon for K, 1st and now 2nd. The meeting is very thorough. I do it with all my kids gathered and my younger ones have learned a lot just from listening to the older child go through this part. For me Saxon is great because it has the whole lesson word for word. This really helps me when I may not be sure how to teach a particular lesson but I can also add to it or take away. Very happy with this curriculum and I plan on continuing with it as well as have my younger ones go through them. I have also done Math U See, and I am pleased with that one as well. It goes more in depth to specific concepts...i.e. adding, subtracting. I will add that sometimes the lessons can be long especially with the meeting, but sometimes they can be really short. We use and love Saxon Math. It doesn't only teach the skill of math, but the logic and thinking behind the operations of math, so there is true learning and understanding of math foundationally layered below the skill work of math. However, sadly, this actual product was billed, "like new" - "no writing in it", but Failed to mention that the first nine lessons were missing altogether. Luckily, we had an older siblings workbook that I erased out, but this was not the product, for the money, I thought I was purchasing.
