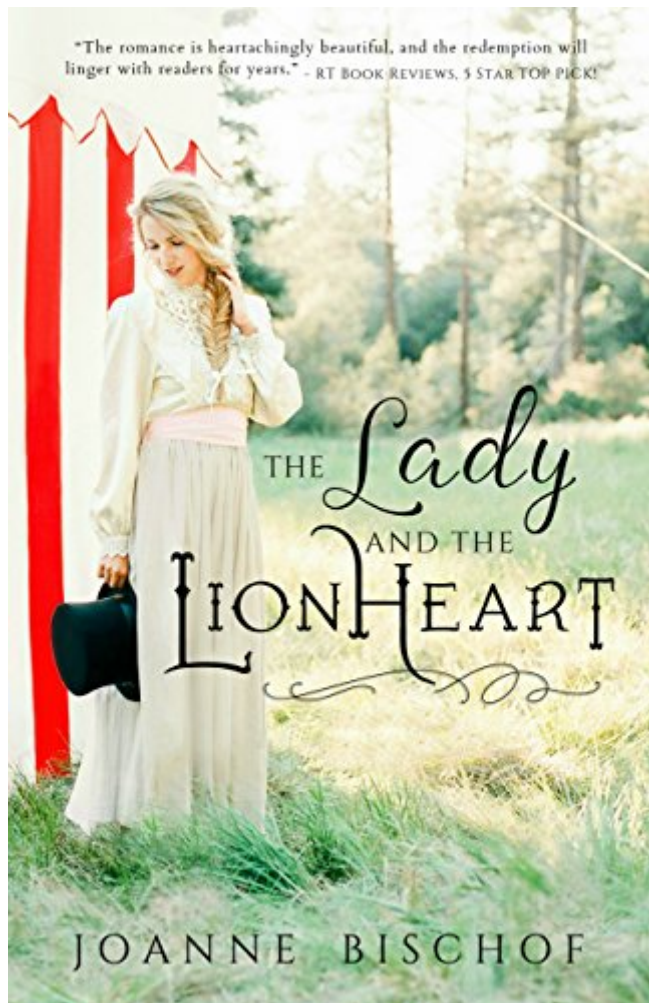




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The Lady And The Lionheart

Have you ever read a book that when you finish, you close the book and hold it to you just so you can hold the story closer? The Lady and the Lionheart by Joanne Bischof was one of those books for me. Ella is a girl from a small town that moved to Roanoke, VA to escape her past and the whispers of her neighbors. She wants to become a nurse and has gotten a job at a doctor's office where she is more like a maid than a nurse since she does more organizing and cleaning than nursing. Late one night a man comes into the physician's office frantically looking for the doctor for his little girl and she is left with the responsibility to care for her. Charlie has been with the circus since he was born. He is the lion tamer, just like his father was. When his ward, Holland, become ill he seeks a doctor's help in the town the circus is in. The doctor looks down on him for being a member of the circus and sends him and Holland back to his tent the next day. The nurse, Ella, comes to his tent daily to help care for Holland and he quickly develops feelings for her. Charlie has a dark secret that he keeps hidden from rubes, non-circus people. Can Charlie trust Ella to share his secret with her? Will it change how Ella sees him? Ella has secrets of her own. Can both of them trust each other enough to share their secrets and their hearts? What will happen when the circus has to move on? What does a lion tamer in the circus have to offer her? The Lady and the Lionheart was one of the best books I've read all year. I couldn't put it down. I wanted to find out what happens with Charlie, Ella, and Holland but I didn't want their story to end! It will definitely be a story that I'll read over and over!

This is an entertaining story from back when circuses traveled from town to town and carried with them human freak shows, animals, and all the set-up. The elephants helped put up and take down circus tents, and the public paid to go and gawk and ridicule. A nurse helps a gypsy child, and she begins to care for the man she thinks is the baby's father. Later, she finds out how much he has sacrificed for a child that's not his. It's a sweet story, and a nice little romance. I think it holds a deep sadness, too, because of the prejudices of the day. The writing is good. It sometimes slows, but overall, the simple plot keeps you turning pages.

Everyone remarks upon what a beautiful cover this is, and to be sure, it is. But the CONTENTS of this book are more beautiful still. Themes of freedom, forgiveness, and redemption flow through this unforgettable story, merging into a modern-day beauty and the beast tale that goes so much deeper than the original. Charlie Lionheart. Holland. Ella Beckley. These names will not be forgotten to readers, as they join the traveling circus, seeing the sights and experiencing it in a whole new way. With emotional nuance and threads that effortlessly tie together, Bischof has crafted a novel that will stand the test of time. This is one of those rare books that cross that "Christian fiction" divide--it is something I would feel comfortable recommending to believers and nonbelievers alike. Universal themes, tied together with the hope of Christ. Not heavy-handed, but the story speaking the truths of the Bible more loudly than wordy monologues. This is one of those rare books I feel I MUST own in softcover so I can loan it out to everyone. Beautiful cover, beautiful writing, and beautiful story. A masterpiece.

Heartaching and beautiful, this story will sweep you away to the colorful sights and sounds of the circus. Bischof has a way of painting pictures with her words. Both lyrical and addictive, her writing style had me drinking in every single word. An inspiring story of sacrifice, unconditional love, forgiveness, hope, faith and redemption. This is a real gem. I can easily say this is my favorite book of all time. Never before has a story struck me so deeply. I was thoroughly engrossed in the book and I truly did not want it to end.
