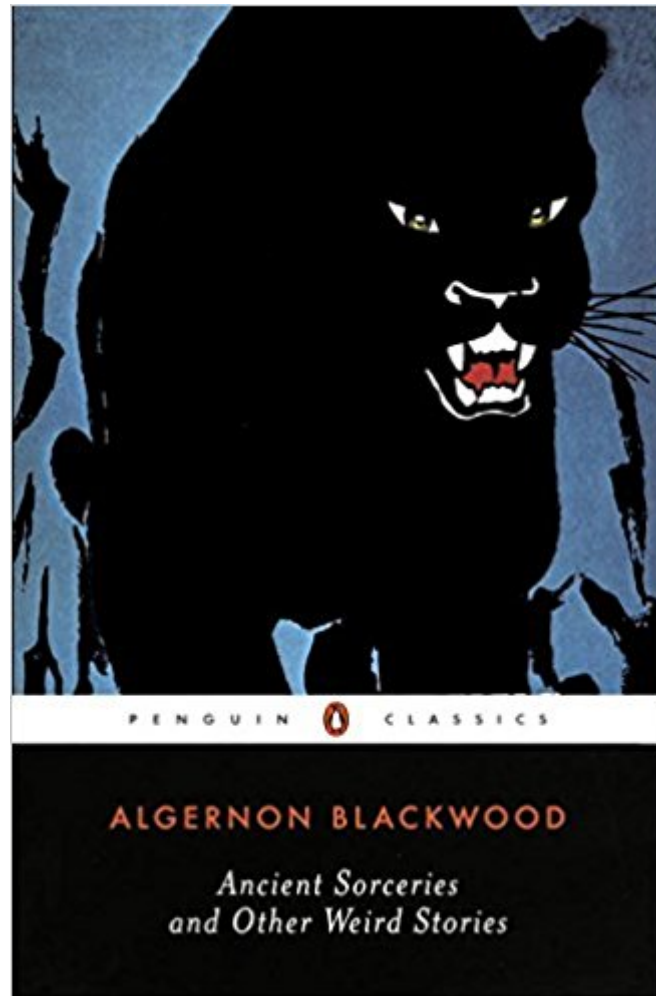




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Ancient Sorceries And Other Weird Stories (Penguin Classics)

Algernon Blackwood, is his name, and he was called to my attention by the editor of a White Nationalist web page, who posted "Willows" on his web site as example of excellent White art.After reading the story, I couldn't get it out of my mind, so I searched the web for information, and ultimately bought this book from . "Willows," is among the stories collected here, and it is better than most; but, as a whole, the entire book is great entertainment.Blackwood, has been compared to Edgar Allen Poe, in his ability to create psychological tension, and palpable unease that creeps up on the reader, and remains awhile. There is great subtlety in the author's presentation of Nature and its relationship to Mankind.There are nine Blackwood stories in this 374 page book, including about twenty five pages of Explanatory Notes, which shed light on the author and the stories. A number of other Blackwood stories are collected in other books, also available at .A good choice for a rainy night of reading, alone, in an isolated location.

This series is one of my favorites. The Blackwood volume is no exception.

A bit of a letdown. I must be missing something because I heard great things about Blackwood and the stories in this volume did not measure up to his reputation. Suspense built nicely in many of the stories and he often created a sense of mystery and unanswered questions but invariably the stories end by fizzling out with no real climax and many loose ends. After reading Grabinski right after Blackwood the contrast between the two is vivid. Grabinski leaves the reader with questions to ponder and a sense of completion while still leaving much of the action up to interpretation.

Blackwood left me with a sense that he could have continued the story indefinitely and after an arbitrary number of words before basically declaring the story over and having the protagonist go home. The exception to this is Wendigo which I thought built nicely, climaxed effectively, and found the correct balance between explaining too much and being incoherently vague. Worth reading to experience a different style of story-telling, but unless your tastes differ greatly from mine will leave you with the feeling that you've read half a story and then set it aside.
