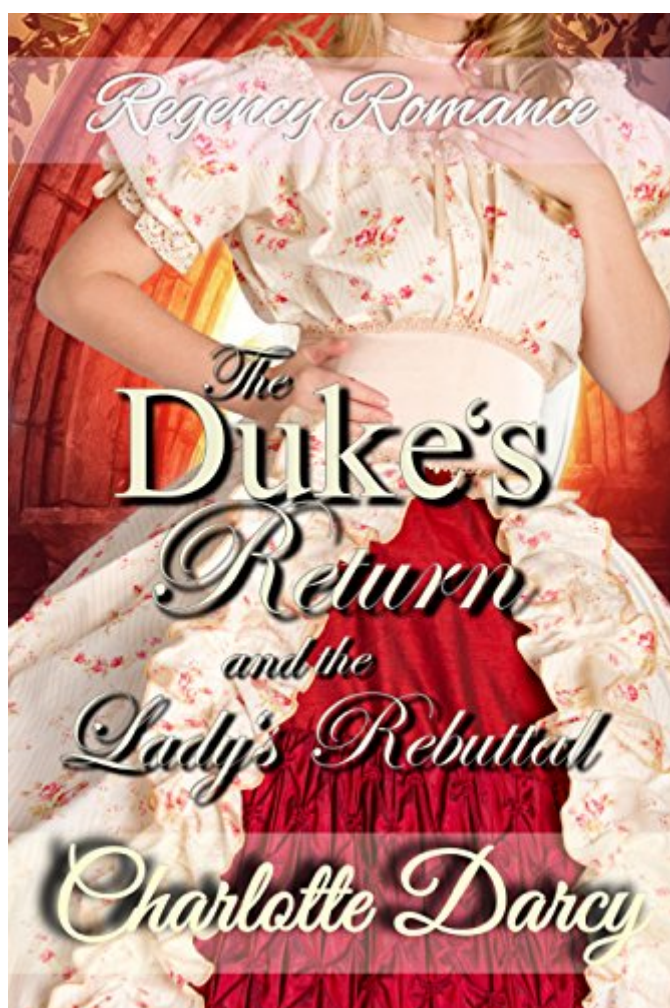

RATHER annoying on a few points. First, the word "rather" as a previous reviewer stated. Second, the fact that the h lived in the house with only her male cousin for a rather prolonged period of time with no older female inhabitant.....I rather think a big no-no for back in the time period. Third, the h herself. Rather annoying and rather spoiled. The attitude throughout 90% of the book was that the H was rather using her by offering marriage and the male cousin was rather wrong because he inherited HER home. In one sentence she rather kinda liked the H and in the very next sentence, she totally rationalized her rather dislike of him. Then rather ripped him apart with her viperish tongue. Exhausting!!! My rather fave part was when the H tells her off and goodbye as he is now going to look for a bride elsewhere. Only to cave and concede that she and only she has his heart to the point that he is rather willing to forfeit his title, inheritance, home and re-enlists in the army. Exhausting and now frustrating! The characters were a bit predictable, but manage to pull off an interesting read. The plot flowed evenly, but at times I felt it was a bit slow, however, it does pick up nicely. This was an interesting read. For some reason, at the beginning, I didn't seem to connect to Aster and Juliet, not sure why. I kept reading and they grew on me. I found about half way through I liked the H/H, actually, I had a better understanding of, Benedict Astor, the Duke of Millington and Juliet Morgan. Juliet is nursing her dying father, upon his death, she knows she will lose her home. The property, house, and land is entailed to her cousin, a man she does not know, but she must marry soon to keep her home. Astor, just returning from 6 years at war, has found his father is dead and the title about to be giving to another. He must marry and soon, as well, to retain his title and property. Then Juliet and Astor run into each other, literally, were they feel a spark.....but will that spark grow into love, respect and a HEA? When accidents start to plague them, they pull together to try to figure out who is behind the accidents and why. Which one are they after, Juliet or Aster? This is when the action really begins to pick, to me. Juliet and Astor have a sweet passion and reserve about them. But can they find their HEA, or will they lose all? Will true love prevail? I found "Duke's Return and the Lady's Rebuttal" to be annoying in the extreme. Benedict returns from war to find that he must marry or lose everything, including his title and lands. Upon her

father's death, Juliet will be dependent upon a distant cousin who promises to cast her away from the estate that has been her lifelong home. Yet, on multiple occasions, Juliet rudely dismisses any possibility of marriage. And Benedict finds marriage to a title seeking miss less than appealing. The hateful behavior of the sister, Rosalind, seems illogical except for the writer's need to include a villainess. Historically, a great deal seems to be off kilter. A duke's only son and heir is allowed to go to war for six years? An otherwise kindly duke could/would deny entailed properties and even the title from his legitimate, living heir? A well-bred lady would live in a home with a cousin distant enough to marry her without even an abigail? Mechanically, most of the story is told through conversation which frequently re-hashes the same information and it's often difficult to identify the speaker. Homonyms are sometimes misused, (eg. vein instead of vain). Plurals are often formed by adding an apostrophe and "s." I expect better from a professional product. In short, I found the book boring, with endless inane conversations, mundane descriptions, and virtually no romance until the last couple chapters. (And those didn't even include a kiss!)

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
