

I have been playing golf for 47 years. I have taken countless lessons. I have hit tens of thousands of golf balls. I have purchased 41 sets of new golf clubs in a vain attempt to buy a golf swing. I have read just about every golf instruction book ever written. Suffice it to say, I am a golf junkie - especially when it comes to acquiring knowledge of the golf swing. I write this Review with the strongest conviction that none of the books I have read can hold a candle to Mr. Watson's book. "The Timeless Swing" is not only technically correct, it is well written. In other words, after reading the book you are not left guessing what the author meant to convey. Instead, the text is clear, the photographs are fantastic and the reader can readily understand the entire instruction. It's all there from Grip to full swing to how to play certain types of shots. The best part is you can take the knowledge to the driving range and EVERYTHING MR.WATSON WRITES WORKS! Mr. Watson's book is brilliant and the work of a genius. You would have to be mad at yourself to not buy this book on .com. In fact, now that I know how good the book is I would have paid 20 times more for it if required! Incidentally, after reading the book I purchased on .com Mr. Watson's DVD, "Lessons of a Lifetime". Believe it or not, the DVD set of two disks is even BETTER than the book and that's saying a lot because the book is the greatest. My recommendation is to buy both the book and the DVD set.
